Registration Fees are nonrefundable due to the costs associated with the preparation of the course materials.

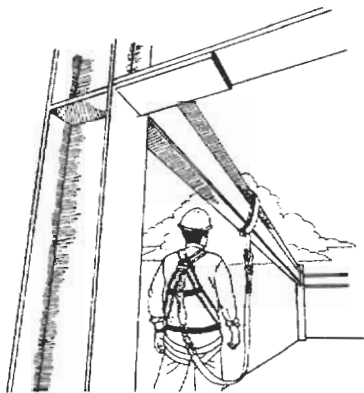
